



PROGRAMMES AND PROGRESIVE ACHIVEMENTS.

This report narrate the project implemented activities from five projects namely USAID Kizazi Kipya funded by PACT Tanzania implemented in Bukoba Dc, USAID Boresha Afya funded by Jhpiego implemented in Bukoba and Muleba DC, SAUT project funded by Jhpiego in Kahama DC, Mtoto Mwerevu funded by IMMA World Health implemented in Bukoba & Chato DC and Maralia, HIV prevention funded by TCDC implemented in Chato DC.

USAID KIZAZI KIPYA

USAID Kizazi Kipya is the USAID funded project by PACT Tanzania in partnership with TADEPA and Bukoba Dc council in 29 wards. The project aim at enabling Orphans, vulnerable(OVC) and young people affected by HIV through utilizing appropriate HIV/AIDS related and other services for improved care, health, nutrition, education, protection , livelihood and psychosocial well being.

Project Results includes

- i. Parents and caregivers have the financial resources to meet the needs of vulnerable children and adolescents.
- ii. Parents and caregivers have the skills to meet the needs of HIV-infected and vulnerable children and adolescents.
- iii. High quality services are available to HIV-infect and vulnerable children and adolescents.

The project is targeting to reach 1902 caregivers, 4755 OVC and youth using 191 community volunteers known as village health case workers known as Case management worker (CCWs) trained as peer facilitators in ARV adherence, counseling, HIV/AIDS care and treatment issues. In addition, there are 106 self help groups [WORTH YETU] groups who are facilitated by 15 Livelihood volunteers (LV) trained on economic strengthen beneficiaries facilitation.

Activity implemented and achievements.

- i. **Increase in Savings and loaning**

A total of 89,334,100 from the beginning is accumulated from group members mandatory and voluntary savings. This amount is collected on weekly basis and taken as a loan where by a total of 826 loans with a total of TSH 61,631,900/= was borrowed by members to contribute to services provision to OVC.

A total of 1195 (Female 610 and 582 Male) received loans from the groups that have enabled them provide services. A total of Tsh 7,587,100/= was spent in support of school needs such as scholastic materials, fees, food, health and clothes for OVC and other family members. Moreover 9 houses from Katerelo, Kasharu, Rubafu, Bujugo, Rubale, Kaagya were constructed and 43 reconstructed from the loan.

ii. Training on Money Management, saving and loaning to LV and OVC Caregivers

from 75 Worth Yetu groups were trained on the best saving and loaning methods to enable them accumulate fund to support their children in areas of health, education, housing, food and nutrition etc.

iii. Free Health service provision.

USAID Kizazi Kipya project supported a total of 504 household with 1532 members with CHF card that granted them 1 year free medical service in their respective health facilities. Each card was provided at the rate of 10,000 per household whereby a total of 5,400,000/ was provided by Project.

iv. Establishment of IGA

A total 354 new income generating activities from the borrowed loan have been established for the period of January- December 2018. Fund provided as loan from their group were used to establish IGA in order to support caregivers reduce loan repayment burden. IGA like Kiosk, mama ntilie, animal leering, agricultural, clothes selling, fish and other food crops have been established and has improved service delivery and over dependence among women.

v. Referral and linkages

A total of 183 beneficiaries were linked to different care and treatment services including health facilities for CTC services, Mtoto Mwerevu program for nutrition services and 12 households from Kyamulaile, Kibilizi and Izimbya linked to Nitetee foundation and were provided with bed sheets, iron sheets, food, mattress and school fees.

Moreover, 324 caregivers were mobilized to establishment of 324 door size garden, care management aiming at improving their children nutritional status and improve health status

vi. Participating in District HIV and Nutritional Committees quarterly meeting,

TADEPA project team participated in Bukoba District council [BCD] HIV committee and other district committees such as Nutrition steering committee facilitated by BDC, with other stakeholders including TACCAID, PANITA and IMMA WOLRD Health. Various issues were discussed on HIV prevalence, prevention and interventions for 90-90-90 strategy. Furthermore, impact mitigation was shared on care and support OVC households.

vii. Service delivery and updating of care plans

All 191 CCWs visited 2143 households and provided different services related to health, education, nutrition, social economic, positive parenting psychosocial and water and hygiene.

80% of household care plans are updated by CCWS in collaboration with care takers during the household visits that have resulted to behavior change on health issues like hand washing, preparation of balanced diet, importance of having toilets, importance of taking ARV and adherence etc. leading to increase in household participation.

viii. Technical Supervision Visits and capacity building to CCWs and LV

A Total 180 technical Supportive supervision visits were conducted by Kizazi Kipya team, TADEPA management and district officers to Community Case Worker, Livelihood Volunteer and CTC focal person on case management, referrals, economic strengthening, care plans development and case

USAID BORESHA AFYA

USAID Boresha Afya project is a five years project funded by USAID government with the aim to support the government to increase access to high quality, comprehensive and integrated health service with a focus on maternal newborn, child and reproductive health outcomes. Since August 2018 TADEPA Team started to implemented USAID Boresha Afya project in 10 wards of Muleba in Muleba DC namely Kasharunga, Kyebyembe, Kagoma, Kamachumu, Ibuga, Mubunda, Bureza, Magata, Gwanseli and Muleba in the catchment of five health facilities of Kamachumu, Kimeya, Kaigara, Kyebitembe and Mubunda. In Bukoba DC the project operate in 5 wards of Bukoba namely Rukoma, Kemondo [Katelero] Katoro, Rubale and Nyakato.

Implemented activities and achievements

- i. **Organized and conducted introductory meeting to 2 CHMT and 15 WDCs members** of Bukoba and Muleba district in order to share USAID Boresha Afya scope of work, planned activities, roles and responsibilities of each part and develop an action plan.
- ii. **Conducting technical supervision visit.** TADEPA In collaboration with 10 CHW supervisors from 10 health facilities, TADEPA organized and conducted monthly meetings in 10 Health facilities with 126 CHWs to review reports, discuss on project activities, share experiences and solve prevailing challenges.
- iii. **Organize and conduct monthly supportive supervision** per month to monitor the progress of community engagement intervention, improving health referrals and service delivery among beneficiaries.
- iv. **Conducting Community score card,** The team of five trained facilitators [4 from TADEPA and 6 from Muleba and Bukoba CHMT], conducted Community Score Card in 20 village namely Magata, Katanga, Kasharunga, Bweyenza and Bihata, Musira, Migara, Bituntu, Mulahya, Rukoma, Katoro, Rubale, Ibosa Whereby expected were 60 per village were expected and 87% participants attended, discussed and developed a village work plan to improve health services.
- v. **Distribution of Social Behavior Change Communication materials** of a Total 1844 brochures featuring different maternal and child health information messages were distributed. Moreover, 1500 PC of condoms have been distributed to community members.
- vi. **2 Cinema Shows, and 7 group gender dialogues** were conducted for awareness creation among community members were by the turnout was good at Katelero and Kamachumu ward were more many were met and capacitated on RHMC issues.
- vii. **Conducting of Gulio la Afya** at Mbunda and Rukoma markets were more than 850 community members attended and got to have the integrated health services including HIV testing, Cancer testing, Maralia testing and they were advised accordingly. Total of 340 clients tested for HIV, 7 were found positive and linked to start treatments. 42 tested for breast cancer and 1 were referred for treatment, 107 tested for malaria and 47 found positive were provided with medicine.
- viii. **20 village action plans developed from community score card** intervention that will influence improvement of quality child health services and have resulted to village and

ward starting to plan and budget for health projects at their levels ie Rukoma villages were mobilized and they have agreed to contribute and construct village health facility.

MTOTO MWEREVU PROJECT.

Since October 2017, TADEPA started the implementation of Community Based Mtoto Mwerevu programme's activities in Bukoba Municipal council and Chato district in partnership with IMA World Health and PANITA funded by the United Kingdom Government through UK AID. The programme targets to reduce stunting through health and Nutrition promotion interventions and in the entire community targeting pregnant mothers and children under 2 years (1000 days)

TADEPA is currently implementing the project activities in five wards of Bukoba municipal namely Kashai, Kitendaguro, Nyanga, Kagondo and Bakoba while in Geita Region, the project is implemented in 5 wards of Chato District namely Bwongera, Chato, Katende, Nyamilembe and Kachwamba.

Our three Strategies include:

Strategy 1: Engagement and strengthening of local Government leaders and community members to gain interest of implementing MTOTO MWEREVU activities in their respective areas.

Strategy 2: Increased number of Pregnant mothers who are linked to early booking of ANC mothers within 12 weeks of pregnant to RCH services.

Strategy3: Create demand of Mtoto Mwerevu services among the community members through their active involvement and participation

Implemented activities and achievements

i. Monthly supportive supervision and capacity building at group and school level.

Total of 12 monthly supervision visit have been done at Bukoba and Chato TADEPA program Officers, management team and ward professionals i.e Community Development, Agriculture and extension officers to 40 groups with 540 and 10 school clubs with 258 in 10 wards. Different nutrition prevailing issues like important of breast feeding, WASH and environment cleanness,

how to prepare balanced diet ,Male involvement and the issue of using available resources like stones, pieces of clothes to create different features(objects) that would help to refresh and help in child development stages were capacitated, discussed and suggested means proposed for improvements.

ii. Conducting Community score card evaluation meeting

The score card evaluation exercise was conducted and it was successful in two wards of Bukoba and Chato. The developed community score card work plan indicators were discussed to enable village leaders mark and evaluate the project performance. was placed at the wall, participant passed through one activity after another by discussing them and giving a number to each indicator. The discussion went well and according to the numbering of indicators, score shows positive improvement (changes) as per November 2017 discussion.

iii. Parcipating in National Breast Feeding Week.

From 1st-8th Of August, TADEPA in collaboration with Bukoba Municipal Council participated in breast feeding week at Kyakailabwa Nane nane stadium, We had a pavilion where all mtoto Mwelevu six habbits and nutritious education where provided to around 2000 community members. Education on the importance of breast feeding, men participation, WASH and environmemntal cleanness, preparation of balanced diet where provided by programme officer. 1000 brochures with nutritious education including Jinsi ya Kunyonyesha mtoto wako, Jinsi ya kukamua maziwa, lische kwa mama mjamzito and jinsi ya kuandaa mlo kamili

iv. Establishment of home and vegetable gardening.

Through group strategy a total of 38 groups and 267 household vegetables gardens have been established to enable beneficiaries acqure vegetables and fruits for their home consumption. This is well impremented as group members have even started to inicieate their fellow neighbors to use available sacks, boxes and buskets to prant vegetables

v. SBCC Strategy(Printing of existing Mtoto Mwerevu brochures and Audio listening)

A total of 2500 Mtoto Mwerevu brochures with messages like Jinsi ya Kumlisha mtoto, Jinsi ya Kunyonyesha, Jinsi ya kuandaa chakula bora, Usafi wa mazingira na unawaji wa mikono were printed, painted and distributed to group members, school pupils to make them aware on different nutritional messages . The brochures were used as means to spread the information's to other family members who could not get direct message from Empowerment workers and other nutrition expertise.

Moreover, TADEPA ward empowerment workers used Mtoto Mwerevu audios where group members listened to the audio and discussed what they understand relating the audios messages and Mtoto Mwerevu six habits. 90% of the members liked the audio as a means to spread information because a lote of people concentrate more on audio and they easy reflect their real

life suggesting more friendly ways to distribute the audio messages can help behavior change among community members.

vi. **Participating on Quarterly nutrition steering committee meeting**

2 TADEPA Mtoto Mwerevu coordinator attended a two days committee meeting on 30 May and 01 June 2018 in which participants discussed nutrition issues and TADEPA team presented a score card tool to participants. Participants were facilitated to discuss all indicators and added their inputs. The time facilitator highlighted to the about acceptable life health nutrition behaviours and good children feeding habits.

SAUTI Project Kahama January 2018 to December 2018

TADEPA SAUTI project team continued with implementation of planned activities that include Social and Behavior Change and Communications, Dreams, Biomedical as well as structural intervention through WORTH+ and SBCC groups to Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW) in twenty (20) wards of Kahama TC Council Empowerment Workers, Community based Health Service Providers (CBHSPs); Male CBHSPs and Expert clients worked in collaboration with TADEPA staff as a community work force to ensure effective implementation of the project.

01. Summary of implemented activities

TADEPA SAUTI project team continued with implementation of planned activities that include Social and Behavior Change and Communications, Dreams, Biomedical, Structural intervention through WORTH+ ,SBCC groups to Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW) in twenty (20) wards of Kahama TC Council ,Empowerment Workers, Community based Health Service Providers (CBHSPs); Male CBHSPs and Expert clients worked in collaboration with TADEPA staff as a community work force to ensure effective implementation of the project.

TADEPA under SBCC intervention has achieved to reach 19 Expert clients which are supported under SAUTI project and managed to reach 19 PSG groups with 2700 number of PLHIV.

Moreover through TADEPA achievements, managed to reach 7735 AGYW under DREAMS intervention through entrepreneur ship trainings (Binti Shuja training) and some AGYW received cash transfer programs.

TDCD SUPPORTED MALARIA SBCC interventions in Chato DC

INTRODUCTION

During the period of January – December 2018, TADEPA has conducted various activities related to focus on malaria Social behavioral Change Communication (SBCC) in all 23 wards of Chato District Council. TADEPA implemented this project under the use of community Change Agent (CCA) platforms in collaboration with some District Health Management team (CHMT members). The project specifically focused to cover the planned activities which are monthly supportive supervision, community initiated events {cultural show events on malaria) and jointly quarterly supportive supervision. TADEPA’s project Planning & Outreach officer in collaboration with DMFP, DSCDO, WEOs, VEO, and CCAs and some clinical officers participated in the implementation of the mentioned planned activities.

Project Catchment areas:-All 23 wards located in Chato district Council.

1.1 Project goal. To reduce infant mortality rate and maternal death.

1.2 Project objectives:

- i. To strengthen working performance of 23 CCAs and linkage between CCAs and their Nearby health facilities.
- ii. To promote knowledge skills on Malaria SBCC through sensitization meetings among the Community members .
- iii. To coordinate mid –media / community initiated activities on malaria by targeting to reach 6,000 community members.

1.3 Planned activities.

- i. To conduct monthly supportive supervision
- ii. To conduct 6 community initiated activities (clinic & cultural shows)
- iii. To conduct quarterly jointly supportive supervision in collaboration with district LGA staffs.

1.4 Accomplished activities

To conduct monthly supportive supervision

Monthly supportive supervision was conducted on September- 2018 for 5 days through field visit by meeting with CCAs in the wards of Buseresere, Muungano , Muganza and Kachwamba . It brought 23 community Change Agents (CCAs) from all wards in the district council. The objective of holding this activity was to supervise & monitor CCAs activities through visiting at their wads and strengthening linkage between CCAs and nearby health facilities. This activity also intended to facilitate CCAs and other LGAs officers in collaborative and integrated approach to implement malaria activities in their respective areas. The planning and Outreach officer initially prepared pre implementation activity plan which summarized the whole process of this activity including preparation of checklist.

Findings occurred during monthly supportive supervision:-

- i. 23 CCAs conducted 12 events on malaria SBCC activities specifically on sensitizing Community members on the importance use of ITNs, Early booking of ANC mothers within 12 weeks in pregnant RCHC services, IRS program and malaria case management .
- ii. CCAs reported assist some community members who were at the witch doctors for treatment of malaria.
- iii. 10,130 people (**3, 519 men & 6,611 women**) were sensitized on malaria SBCC by CCAs through household visits in all 23 wards located in Chato district Council.

- iv. Malaria monthly data reports shows to increase in many health facilities and dispensaries as summarized in table no. 01 below. The main causes of high preference on malaria rate in these areas were illegal utilization of ITNs for fishing and fencing trees.

To conduct 6 community initiated activities (cultural shows)

In this quarter (August- October 2018) , TADEPA conducted 6 community initiated activities in all 6 wards of Buseresere, Nyamilembe, Makurugusi, Muganza, Kigongo and Ichwankima located in Chato district council. These events took place at the market areas and at secondary school as per pre – implementation activity action plan prepared. Cultural shows conducted in those wards reached the total number of

6,029 people (2,152 men & 3,877 women) who were sensitized on the topics concerned with the importance use of ITNs, early booking of ANC for pregnant mothers with the early 12 weeks, malaria case management & male involvement were the messages presented by TADEPA's staff in collaboration with CCAs and to some location the DMFP and participated to facilitate these activity. TADEPA used cultural show groups which initially were identified by CCAs in their locations, these groups have been trained on malaria SBCC sensitization.
